Carolus Magnus


- Carolus = Charles
- Magnus, a, um (adj.) = great, large

Charlemagne (French) = Carolus Magnus (Latin)

"Charles, by the grace of God and the gift of His mercy, king and ruler of the kingdom of the Franks, devout defender and humble supporter of the holy church, give greetings of lasting peace and beatitude to all grades of the ecclesiastical order and to all ranks of the secular power, in Christ our Lord, eternal God."


Carolingian Legends: Crowning of Pippen III

Legend #1: Pippen (III) sought assistance of

Pope Zacharias

"in accordance with the command of the Pope, he was called King of the Franks, and he was anointed to the dignity of this honour... by the hand of Boniface... and, as is the custom of the Franks, was raised on to the throne..."

--Annals regni Francorum (Royal Frankish Annals), late 8th to early 9th century




Image: Crowning of Pippen III, 15th c.

Carolingian Religious Reforms

New church appointments

Support and establish monasteries

Marriage reforms

- Charlemagne: discredit divorce
- Louis the Pious: laws against concubines and children, need for parental consent for marriage (plus property and bride gift)

Crowning of Charlemagne in Rome, 800

- Biographer Einhard "he declared he would not have set foot in the church the day it was conferred, although it was a great feast day, if he could have foreseen the Pope's [Leo III] design."
- Charlemagne as "Holy Roman Emperor"



Carolingian Renaissance

- Emphasis on education
- Teaching reading and writing at monasteries
- Revise liturgical books
- Adoption of Benedictine Rule for all monasteries
- Creation of intellectual elite at Aachen
