

Men: Rational, strong, morally superior


## "Woman" (14<sup>th</sup> century)

- weak


#### Men

- strong


# Galen, (131-201)


## Ideology and Law

IF women are believed to be mentally, physically, and morally weaker than men




Need to protect women

- Guinevere




# Townspeople



## Manufacturing: Artisan Workshops

- Stratified by trade
  - Goldsmiths higher than masons or carpenters
- Stratified within trades
  - Master artisan
  - Journeyman
  - apprentice

#### **Apprenticeship**

- Start age 7-10
- Work for 7-10 years learning and being trained in trade
- Receive room, food and clothing, plus training

## Guilds = corporation with economic, religious, and social functions

- Assured quality of products
- Protected profits
- Regulated prices
- Provided charity
- Centre for social activities





## Women and Guilds

- Often excluded
- Women in cloth production
- Female guilds in Paris, Rouen, and Cologne
- 13<sup>th</sup> c Paris: 7 female or female-dominated guilds
